



As the organising authority of 2017 Club Marine Victorian Junior and Youth Championships advises competitors and coaches that the following philosophies and methods will be used at the regatta:

- ✓ There will be a daily briefing with the jury and coaches;
- ✓ Each competitor's briefing will include an educational component
- ✓ The jury will meet with competitors in the rigging area on a daily basis. This is primarily for educational purposes, and may include giving warnings on possible minor rule breaches.
- ✓ The on-water jury may notify competitors on the water that a rule breach was observed. In this case competitors may consider whether taking a penalty at the time is appropriate, or to initiate a protest.
- ✓ Protests may be initiated by the jury under RRS 60.3. As a guide, the jury will only initiate a protest where there has been:
  - A blatant breach of a rule by a boat;
  - A boat gaining a significant advantage;
  - Damage or injury;
  - A breach of rule 2; or
  - Repeated minor breaches of a rule.
- ✓ The application or non-application of these principles is not grounds for redress.
