



School Team Sailing On-Water Safety

Generally Lower Risks ... but...



- Usually close to shore or protected area
- Umpire boats and changeover boats are the safety boats Close proximity
- Very good view of racing
- Whistles (and PFDs and footwear)
- Teachers have 1st aid kits, robust list of medical conditions and emergencey contacts
- We can have a variety of skills in the competition some may misjudge their ability.
- Squalls

Squalls / Capsize / Misjudgement



- Mains may be reefed, but this does not mean everyone can then handle the boats
- Can't get to centre-board climb back in boat

Umpires may intervene when a matter of safety

 Squall flattens fleet – get competent sailors from changeover boats to assist – 3 person sail in without jib – slow but safe.

Injury - Medical



- Sailors to blow whistles
- Umpires to respond
- Unless sure umpires have under full control other boats help RRS1
- Sailors should blow whistles for other boats in danger RRS1
- Umpires use incident controller procedure
- Take to lower landing or beach
- Get Teacher In Charge ASAP

Incident response



- First Responder
 - Observe, Assess, Respond and Communicate
- Incident Controller
 - Called in to control response
 - Can commandeer resources
- Race Officer
 - Manages Fleet safety / race
- Changeover
 - Supports / enables responses and shore requirements
- Teacher in Charge / Coach
 - Provides medical issues / history has emergency contacts has guardian authority
- Duty Manager
 - Responsible for Onshore Emergency Plan Completion

Anyone can call 000 if they think it is needed. DRSABCD
"If you think you need an Ambulance –

You need to Call 000 or 112"

Call the Incident Controller



When to call

- Couta Boat needs tow/ rescue
- Injury Medical risk –
 Hypothermia Head injury
- Busted boat?
- Incapable Crew?
- Risk / Unsure:
 Don't know how bad it is

How you call

- This is Red Ron, This is Red Ron
- We are at the Dinghy Outer Gate, Dinghy Outer Gate
- We have an Asthma Attack we have an Asthma Attack
- We need assistance, we need assistance [or] We may need assistance, we may need assistance

Specific Risks / Controls — St Kilda



- Boat washed under pier
 *Marshall Hawes can go under pier at west end
- Sailing School / SUP beginners
 *Traffic separation agreements
 *Umpires can define them as an obstruction
- Foot injuries* Footwear requirement
