The Tamar River was named after the River Tamar in South West England by Colonel William Paterson in December 1804. Despite its name it is not actually a river as it is saline and tidal over its entire length.



<u>The River Tamar</u> is a river in south west England, that forms most of the border between Devon (to the east) and Cornwall (to the west). The area is a World Heritage Site due to its historic mining activities.

The name Tamar is said to mean "Great Water." The Tamar is one of several British rivers whose ancient name is assumed by some to be derived from a prehistoric river word apparently meaning "dark flowing" and which it shares with the River Thames.

News from Boat wise - Spring 2015

MAST has received about 20 comments from people in regards to the non-issue of licence cards. These comments have related to those who are travelling overseas or interstate and may need to produce proof of a licence if hiring or chartering a boat. Whilst many hire companies contact MAST to verify a licence, some take the licence card as confirmation of a licence.

For those travelling interstate and overseas, a licence card is available for a fee of only \$7.55 if required.

These can be applied for by downloading an **Application for Duplicate Licence- Plastic Card** form from the MAST website www.mast.tas.gov/recreational/forms/ or by applying through any of the Service Tasmania Shops.

Beacon registration going mobile from 15 September 2015

The Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) is giving beacon owners more choice, with an improved online beacon registration system from 15 September 2015.

The registration system on the AMSA website will be mobile-optimised, handy for renewing beacon registration from a mobile or tablet.

Providing proof of registration will also become easier, with beacon owners able to show beacon registration confirmation on their mobile phone or tablet via SMS or email.

Vessel and aircraft owners can save their SMS or email on their mobile as proof of registration to comply with the law from 15 September 2015.

AMSA representative, Christine Macmillian, acknowledged that this development is a result of feedback from beacon owners about registration stickers.

"After reviewing feedback about the existing beacon registration sticker system, we quickly found that a more mobile friendly method of proving beacon registration was needed," said Ms Macmillian.

"The new system gives beacon owners more options to save their registration information on their mobile phone through an SMS or email.

"Registering your beacon could mean the difference between life and death in a distress situation. It can give search and rescue authorities important information to provide a quicker response." said Ms Macmillian.

Existing beacon registration stickers will continue to be recognised until they expire or need replacing, then proof of registration will be issued through the new methods.

Beacon registration renewal will continue to be free and take place every two years.
